Dear Johana,

Thank you for contacting us about your upcoming trip to Haiti. I hope you have an enjoyable time.

God's Littlest Angels is an independent, non-profit, donation supported ministry dedicated to serving abandoned, malnourished, and premature infants and children in Haiti. We are located in the mountains just above Petionville. We operate an orphanage with 170 children, a neonatal intensive care unit and a step down medical unit. GLA has been in operation since 1994 and began doing international adoptions in 1997. We also assist with several children's ministries in the local community.

We have approximately 100 babies age 0-2 in our main facility and 70 toddlers through age 7 in our Toddler House. Below is the cost of running the orphanage for 1 day:

Diapers cost \$85 per day.

Baby formula is \$170 per day.

Doctor costs average \$35 per day.

The entire nursery budget including the above, Doctors, Medicine and supplies is \$530 per day.

Water costs \$144 per day on average.

Rice costs \$15.43 per day, we use 300 lbs per week.

Total groceries and supplies budget is \$850 per day. (food, cleaning supplies, toilet paper etc.) This is for over 300 adult meals, over 200 toddler meals, plus snacks of fresh fruit (banana, mango, other fruit in season)

Diesel fuel for cars averages \$33 per day, for generators it is \$147 per day. Total cost to run the generators is \$185 per day. (18 hours or more) Total vehicle cost is \$160 per day.

Total personnel cost is \$650 per day, over \$400 of this is for Haitian workers.

Rent costs \$150 per day (for the 4 houses).

Because we have so many babies, we use an amazing amount of baby lotion, powder, shampoo, diapers, powdered formula, diaper cream, and baby wipes. These items are expensive to buy in Haiti, therefore donations of the above are greatly appreciated. Small toys that are easily cleaned are also appreciated. (No stuffed animals, it is too difficult to keep them clean.)
